**Jottings** 

Although referred to in some quarters as Alfred George, his birth was registered as Alfred only and this was the only forename that appeared on his marriage certificate

His name was often misspelt in the press as Gittens or Gettins, with the latter being used regularly during his time in the North of England or with Scottish clubs

No first team appearances for Bolton Wanderers or for Fulham, where the handbook for the 1910-11 season records him as 5ft 8in

His single appearance for Blackpool, where he was an amateur, was in a 1-1 home draw with West Bromwich Albion on 17.9.1904

Won a Southern League Championship medal with Queens Park Rangers in 1907-08, when he was the club's joint top scorer along with future Robin, Walker

Played in both games in the first ever Charity Shield when, as Southern League champions, Queens Park Rangers drew 1-1 with Manchester United (the Football League at Stamford Bridge on 8.4.1908 - with Manchester United winning the replay, also at Stamford Bridge, 4-0 on 8.8.1908

Appeared for Croydon Common in 3 minor cup matches, scoring 1 goal

Represented the London select

The appearances/goals in the Lancashire Combination shown above while he was at Accrington Stanley are the minimum confirmed; he may have played/scored more, but full details are not readily available

Scored two hat tricks for Accrington Stanley; Hyde 3 Accrington Stanley 3 on 9.9.1911 and Accrington Stanley 6 Denton 2 on 16.12.1911

Was Dumbarton's joint top league scorer in the 1914-15 season with 8 goals and he also scored at least 4 goals in the Dumbartonshire Cup

At Partick Thistle, he played twice in the Glasgow & District Midweek Cup in 1912-13 and three times in the Glasgow Cup in 1913-14, all without scoring

On 12.1.1924, he played for Dunkeld & Birnam away against his old club, Partick Thistle, in an 11-0 defeat in the 1st. Round of the Scottish Cup

The 1901 Census records him living at 11 Oakley Street, Salford with his father (a fish monger), his mother and his five siblings

The 1911 Census records him as a professional footballer living with his wife Alice as boarders at 110 Frensham Road Southsea, as he was with Portsmouth at the time


Rreputed to be a clever capture (Athletic News on his signing with Luton Town)


