Jottings

Joined the Post Office in Peterborough in 1901 and was still employed there in the 1930s

Rejoined Peterborough City for the 1914-15 season as player/manager

Was apparently known as "Artie" at Peterborough City

Peterborough City held a smoking concert in October 1912 to celebrate his marriage and to present him with a spirit tantalus; his wife Nellie died in 1959

Served in the postal section of the Royal Engineers from November 1914 to August 1919

By 1932, he was a supervisor at Peterborough General Post Office, the secretary of the Peterborough branch of the Union of Post Office Workers (a role he had already by then held for more than 10 years), a magistrate and a member of the management committee of Peterborough Memorial Hospital

Was also a good amateur cricketer

He lived for many years at 127 Fletton Avenue, Peterborough

Reputed to be the cleverest full-back in the South Eastern League (Portsmouth Evening News - 20 May 1913)
