Although universally known as LLOYD EVANS during his career, his actual name as per his birth certificate and baptism was James Lloyd EVANS

His birth certificate records him as being born at 39 St. Philip Street, Battersea

The 1901 Census records him as a builder's clerk living at 26 Elsley Road, Battersea, with his father James (45), a painter, mother Mary (44), sister Jessie (13) and a boarder

Played one Western League match for Queens Park Rangers Reserves in his second spell with the club in the 1904-05 season, without scoring

In its report of the Southern League match between Queens Park Rangers and Millwall on 25 February 1905, the Athletic News recorded that "*He was fairly fast, and at times centred well, but was too easily pushed off the ball, and after receiving some very vigorous attentions, he acted on the old adage that discretion was the better part of valour.*"

On Thursday 23.11.1905, he represented Surrey in a 4-0 win over Norfolk, played on his home ground at West Norwood, without scoring

Played at least one match for Fulham Reserves in the London League; a 0-0 draw at West Ham Reserves on Christmas Day 1905

Played two Western League matches for Brentford Reserves in the 1907-08 season, without scoring

Signed as an amateur for Southend United in his first spell at the club in 1907

Apparently, his time at both Southern United and Romford Town was on loan

Appeared for the London F.A. in a 4-2 away defeat to the Birmingham F.A. on Wednesday 31.3.1909, without scoring

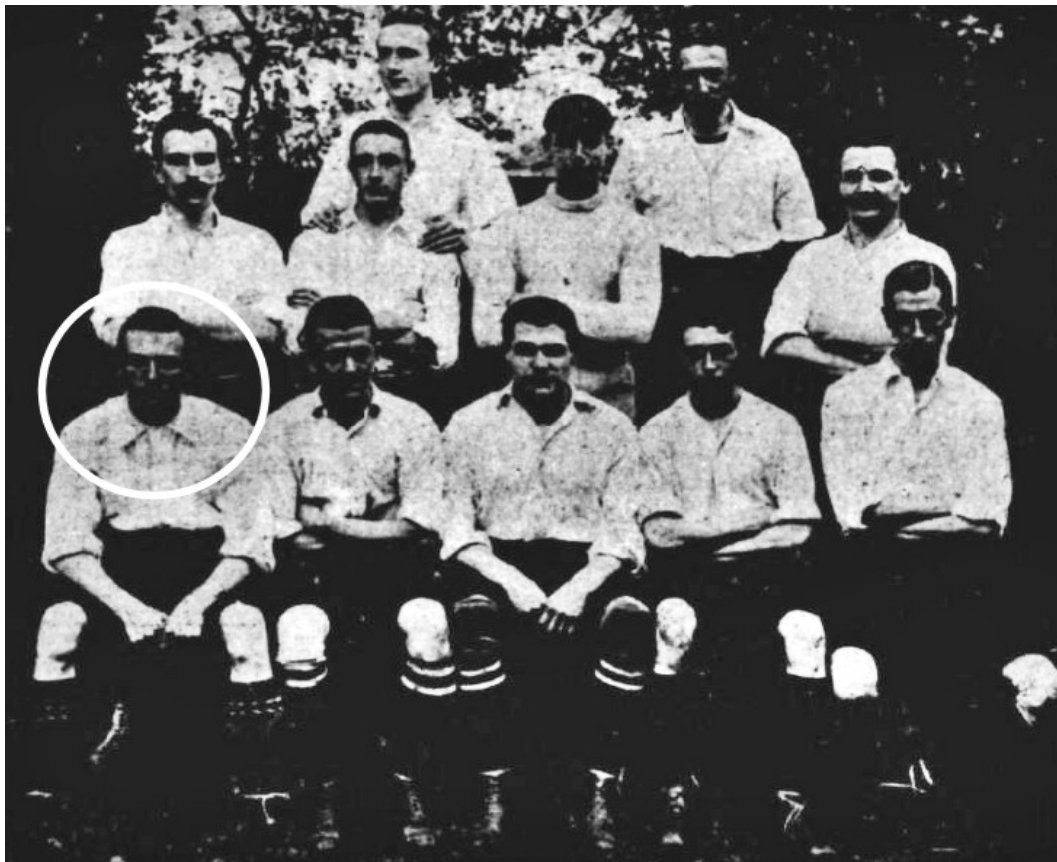

Also played for Southend United Reserves in the South Essex League, scoring at least two goals

The 1911 Census records him as Lloyd Evans (no James), a professional footballer living with three other players at 31 Gordon Avenue, Southend on Sea

Married Heloise Lily Smith on 30 November 1912 in St. Marks Church, Battersea

In the 1939 National Register, he was recorded as married and an accounts clerk
