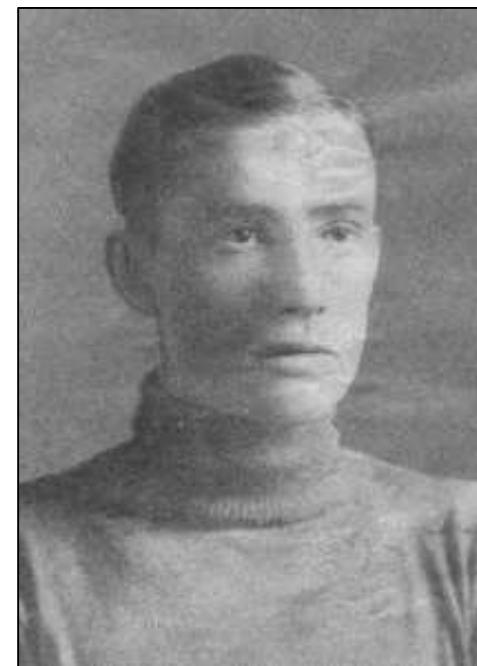

His appearance for the Robins in 1911-12 was shortly after he had joined Catford Southend
Played for The Reds in a Fulham pre-season practice match at Craven Cottage on Saturday 31 August 1912 and was on the losing side in an 8-2 defeat to the previous season's Fulham first team, playing as The Whites
Catford Southend won the inaugural Athenian League in 1912-13 and he scored from the penalty spot in the 1-0 win over Tufnell Park that secured the title, having also scored from the spot in the previous match (9-0 v. Grays Athletic)
On Saturday 5 September 1914, he was selected to play in two matches: (i) for the Athenian League against the previous season's champions Tufnell Park (lost 2-1) and (ii) for Croydon Common Reserves against Millwall Reserves in the London League (won 2-1) ... however, it has not proved possible to discover if he played in either game
Made no first team appearances after joining Croydon Common for the 1914-15 season, but played for the reserve side
Served as a sergeant in the 70th. Field Company, Royal Engineers in the war
Was part of the Wycombe Wanderers side that won the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup, beating Maidenhead 4-0
Represented Berks & Bucks against Bedfordfordshire on Thursday 18 October 1923 in the Southern Counties Amateur Championship; won 5-0
Was awarded a Berks & Bucks senior badge in June 1924
In July 1924, he scored 68 in a cricket match for Shepherds Bush against Slough
