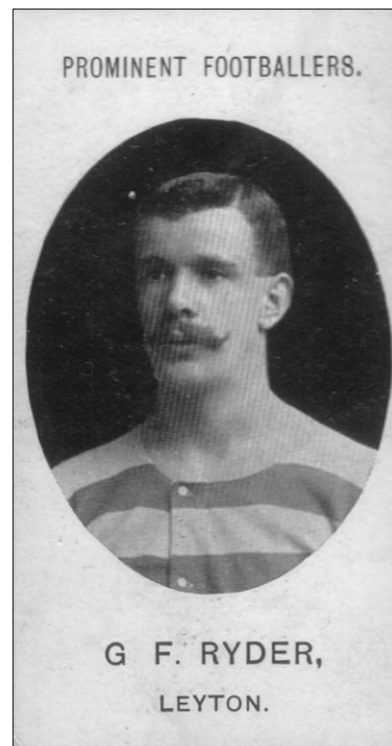

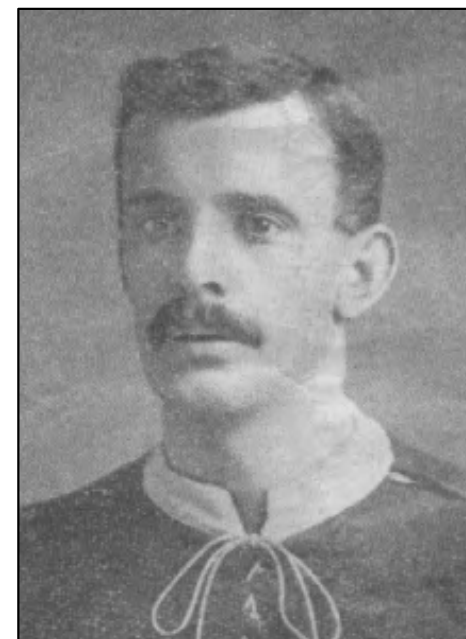

<i>Jottings</i>
Not to be confused with the George Ryder who played for the Corinthians in the early 1900s and studied law at Oxford University
The 1901 Census records him as a slater living at 21 Derby Street, Westgate, Newcastle with his widowed father Isaac (58) and his brother Anthony (14)
Won the Northumberland Senior Cup and the Northern Alliance championship with Morpeth Harriers in 1902-03, along with future Common goalkeeper Bob Hewitson
Was top scorer for Queens Park Rangers in the 1905-06 season and for Leyton in the 1910-11 season
Captained Distillery, Leyton and Linfield
The 1911 Census shows him living a professional footballer at 23 Dunedin Road, Leyton, with his wife Jane (24), daughters Isabel (3) and Evelyn (0), his brother Anthony (24) and his wife's sister and a boarder

Jottings (continued)

While at Distillery for the 1911-12 season he appeared for the Irish League against the Southern League (0-2 in Belfast on 30.9.1911), the Football League (0-4 at Anfield on 16.10.1911) and the Scottish League (0-3 in Glasgow on 30.10.1911)

Played regularly for Distillery when the club came second in the Irish League in the 1911-12 season

Joined Distillery without the payment of a transfer fee to Leyton as there was no reciprocal transfer agreement between Ireland and England; however, when all five Belfast clubs resigned from the Irish F.A. in February 1912, in protest over the suspension of a number of club officials, he was virtually forced to rejoin Leyton

Although still with Distillery, he played for Linfield in a friendly match against Nottingham Forest at Windsor Park on Monday 1.1.1912; Linfield won 2-1

Won the Northumberland Senior Cup with Blyth Spartans in 1913-14 and scored in the final against Ashington at St. James Park on Saturday 7 March 1914

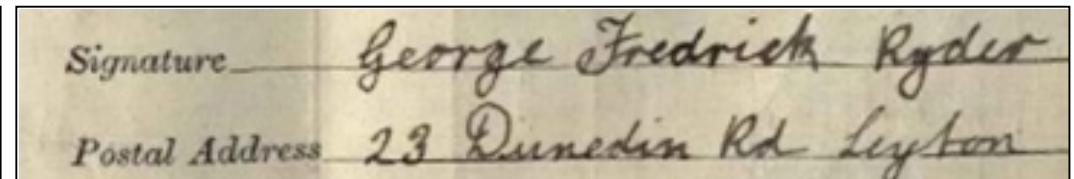
Played regularly for Blyth Spartans during the 1913-14 season and scored regularly too

Appeared for Croydon Common in 3 minor cup matches, without scoring

Died in the Newcastle City Mental Hospital of a brain haemorrhage, possibly caused by a career of heading leather footballs



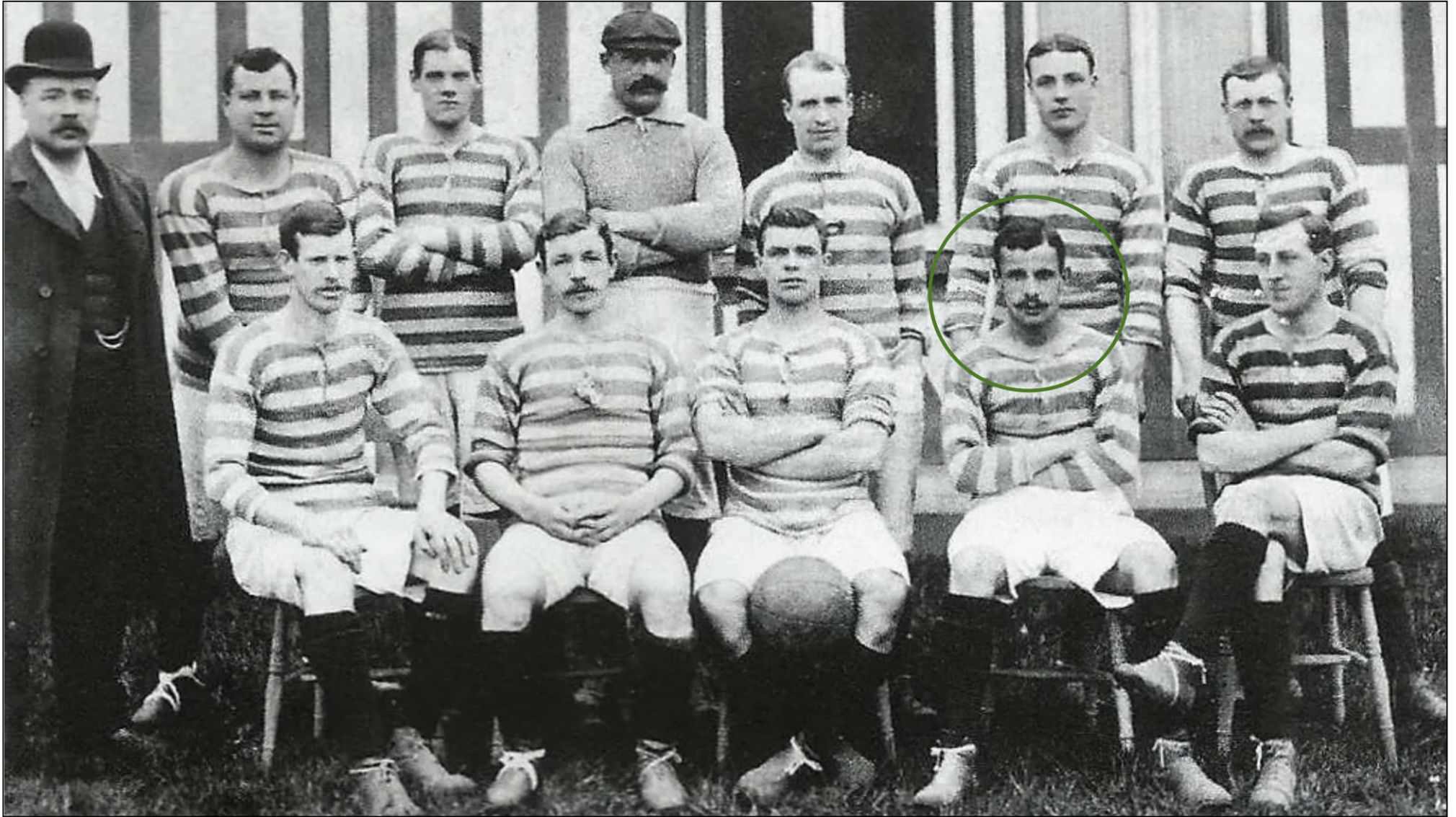
Queens Park Rangers 1905-06
