Played for St. George's Albion against Pitlake Swifts in the final of the Croydon Charity League on Easter Monday 24.4.1905; they lost 3-0
Played regularly for St. George's Albion with his brother, William Henry VINTEN
The 1901 Census records him at living in Albert Road, Croydon with his father John (42), a bricklayer, his mother Mary (40), his grandmother Mary (68) and siblings Thomas (16), William (11) and Charles (2)
Married Ada Barnett in Q4 1908 in Croydon
The 1911 Census records him as a house painter living at 79 Harrington Road, Croydon with his wife Ada (26) and son Alfred (1)
Played regularly for Beckenham Rovers when the club were runners-up in both the Sydenham & District League and the Bromley & District League in 1905-06, scoring once
Played for Beckenham Rovers when the club won the Beckenham Hospital Cup on 21.4.1906; a 5-0 win in the final against Anerley Swifts (after a 0-0 draw)
Played regularly for Beckenham Rovers when they won the championship of Premier Division of the Sydenham & District League in 1906-07
Played regularly for Beckenham Rovers when they won the championship of Division One of the Bromley & District League in 1906-07
Scored 4 goals for Beckenham Rovers during the 1906-07 season
Played for Beckenham Rovers against the Bromley & District League on 14.9.07
Was elected vice-captain of Beckenham Rovers for the 1907-08 season and became captain when Fred Moody left and joined Croydon Common
Scored 2 goals in all competitions for Beckenham Rovers during the 1907-08 season before joining Croydon Common
Made his only Croydon Common first team appearance with fellow Beckenham Rovers player Fred Moody who was making his debut; a 2-0 defeat away at Southend United
Played a few matches for Croydon Common Reserves
A "C. Vinten" started playing for Beckenham Rovers in the 1908-09 season; possibly his brother Charles
Returned to Beckenham Rovers in September 1909 having missed much of the year with an injured wrist, but he had left the club by January 1910
Served as Sapper 184450 in the Corps of Royal Engineers in WW1 and was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal
The 1921 Census records him as a painter living at 79 Addison Road, Croydon, with his wife Ada and his son Alfred (12)
The 1939 Register records him as a painter and decorator living at 79 Addison Road, Croydon, with his wife Ada
